Ishan stars as SRH rout RCB by 48 runs

Lucknow, May 24: Ishan Kishan lit up the Ekana Stadium with a dazzling unbeaten 94 off 48 balls as Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH) overpowered Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) by 42 runs in a high-octane IPL 2025 clash here on Friday.

Kishan, whose audacious strokeplay and fearless improvisation defined SRH's innings, anchored a mammoth total of 231 for 6, which proved well beyond RCB's reach. The left-hander's knock, a perfect blend of flair and finesse, came just when SRH needed a statement win to reinforce their top-two ambitions.

Asked to bat first, SRH began with intent

as Abhishek Sharma and Travis Head took on the new ball. Abhishek blazed 34 off just 17 balls, smashing three sixes and as many boundaries - including a monstrous hit off Bhuvneshwar Kumar that famously shattered the windshield of a display Tata Curvv, drawing gasps from the crowd.

Head fell cheaply for 17, triggering a brief wobble as Bhuvneshwar and Lungi Ngidi struck in quick succession to reduce SRH to 54 for 2. But Kishan steadied the innings with initial restraint before unleashing a furious onslaught post his fifty in the 14th over. A cheeky scoop for six off Romario Shepherd and a sublime slice over

extra cover typified his range.

The 17th over brought a moment of drama when Kishan, attempting a reverse stance, was denied a wide - sparking animated exchanges. He responded with a brutal six off the very next ball from Bhuvneshwar, stamping his authority on the contest.

Cameos from Aniket Verma (26 off 9), Heinrich Klaasen (24 off 13), and Abhinav Manohar (12 off 10) added late impetus. Skipper Pat Cummins chipped in with 13 off 6 in the death overs, propelling SRH to their highest total of the season.

For RCB, Romario Shepherd stood out with 3 for 42, while Bhu-

vneswar and Krunal Pandya picked up two wickets apiece.

In reply, RCB's chase never really took off. Phil Salt struck a rapid 62 (32 balls, 4 fours, 5 sixes), while Virat Kohli added 43 off 25, but the rest of the lineup crumbled under sustained pressure.

Captain Jitesh Sharma (24) and Romario Shepherd (28 off 14) offered resistance, but SRH's bowling proved too disciplined.

Cummins led from the front with 3 for 28, supported by Eshan Malinga (2/37) and Harshal Patel (1/39), as RCB were bundled out for 189 in 19.1 overs.

Dilip overwhelms Varun in MMCSA snooker final

Srinath named match referee for World Test Championship

Dubai, May 24: New Zealand's Chris Gaffaney and England's Richard Illingworth have been named as on-field umpires for the ICC World Test Championship Final 2025, set to take place at Lord's from June 11 to 15, the International Cricket Council (ICC) on Friday said.

The highly anticipated clash will see South Africa take on Australia in the culmination of a fiercely contested two-year Test cycle for the mace. The match will be overseen by experienced Indian match referee Javagal Srinath.

Illingworth, who was also part of the officiating team in the 2021 and 2023 finals, continues his consistent presence in marquee Test matches. He is also the current ICC Umpire of the Year, having won the David Shepherd Trophy

for the fourth time in 2024.

Gaffaney had partnered with Illingworth in officiating last year's ICC Men's T20 World Cup Final, and also officiated in the WTC 2023 Final between India and Australia.

Illingworth will be making history in the Ultimate Test, having stood as an on-field umpire for all the three World Test Championship Finals.

Richard Kettleborough, also from England, who has officiated in the finals of several marquee ICC events, including the Men's Cricket World Cup and the Champions Trophy has been appointed as the TV umpire, after having played the same role in the WTC 2021 final between India and New Zealand.

India's Nitin Menon has been named as the fourth umpire for

the contest, marking his debut in a World Test Championship Final, after having served as the TV umpire for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup Final in 2021.

ICC Chair Jay Shah commended the experience and merit of the appointed officials and expressed confidence in their performance.

"We are pleased to announce an experienced team of match officials for the ICC World Test Championship Final at Lord's, marking the culmination of a highly competitive two-year cycle of Test matches played around the world," he said.

"We strive to select the most qualified and deserving officials for all matches, and we are confident they will perform admirably. On behalf of the ICC, I wish them all the best and hope they enjoy this assignment," Shah added.

So now we're sending a delegation.

When minorities were lynched, we spun stories faster than our news anchors' fans.

And when the international community raised an eyebrow, we told them to mind their colonial business.

We yelled so often, so loudly, about imaginary attacks on our "national pride," that now, when there's an actual reason for national pride—like a measured, strategic military response—the world blinks and says, "But you've been spreading falsehoods and rejecting all the truths we brought to your doorstep before, are you crying wolf again?"

And here's the punchline: worse still, we're not just losing the world's trust—we're losing our own people's belief. Scroll through social media today, and you'll find citizens second-guessing their own government. Not out of disloyalty, but because they've been bluffed one too many times.

And so, we send a delegation. Not to declare victory, but to beg for credibility.

Let that sink in dear people. Truth, you see, is like our credit card—it continues working if we haven't reached its limit, by spending on frivolous purchases.

Unfortunately we swiped ours on inflated data, doctored headlines, and nightly news

drama.

Now, at the checkout counter of international opinion, the card gets declined.

"Sorry, insufficient authenticity. Use another card!" So, we did. We called in the opposition to help!

After this tragic lesson, what should we start doing?

Simple: Stop lying and start telling the truth!

Stop labelling every critic as "anti-national," and start asking: "What if they're right?"

Start acknowledging those hunger reports, those poverty rankings, those uncomfortable truths.

Because until we clean up our own mirror, we can't complain that the world sees a distorted image.

And next time something brave and bold is done—like taking a stand, not just militarily but morally—we won't need a delegation to explain it.

Truth doesn't need a spokesperson. It can stand on its own.

Because after crying wolf for so long, we forgot what truth sounds like—and so did the world...!

Liang beats Lin in World TT

Doha, May 24: Top-ranked Chinese Lin Shidong had his journey snapped by compatriot Liang Jingkun at the World Table Tennis Championships here on Friday.

The 20-year-old, who had entered three events in Doha, suffered a seven-set (5-11, 8-11, 11-7, 11-5, 11-8, 8-11, 11-7) defeat to the 28-year-old and fifth-ranked Liang in the men's singles quarterfinals.

Liang will now face the winner between World Cup champion Hugo Calderano of Brazil and An Jae-hyun of South Korea.

The women's singles quarterfinals will see Chinese players clash with Japanese on four fronts, with fourth-seeded Chinese Wang Yidi already eliminated by eighth seed Mima Ito 4-1.

TN to host first Hockey India Masters Cup

New Delhi, May 24: Hockey India on Friday officially announced the venue and dates for the first-ever Hockey India Masters Cup 2025 (Men & Women).

The inaugural edition of this pioneering tournament will be hosted by the Hockey Unit of Tamil Nadu in Chennai from June 18 to 27.

This event marks a new chapter in Indian hockey, offering a dedicated platform for veteran players. With competitions in both men's and women's categories, the Hockey India Masters Cup is poised to be a celebration of longevity, passion, and the enduring love for the game.

As per the regulations, a player must be aged 40 and above to compete in the men's category and 35 and above in the women's category.

The names of the teams for both categories will be released shortly. To participate in the event, players must register through their respective State Member Units.
