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Tokyo unveils stringent norms for Olympics

Foreign fans banned, no decision on local spectators

Follow rules or face music, athletes warned

Tokyo, June 16: If athletes coming to Japan for the Tokyo Olympics needed a warning, they got it Tuesday as officials rolled out the third and final rendition of so-called Playbooks the rulebooks governing behavior for these pandemic-tainted games.

The message: Follow the rules when the Olympics open in just over five weeks, or else expect a warning or a fine or anything in between.

“Respect the Playbook, respect the rules,” said Olympic Games Executive Director Christophe Dubi, speaking on a remote hook-up with Tokyo organizers.

The Playbooks rolled out Tuesday were for athletes. But updates for others like media, broadcasters, sponsors, and so forth will come

within the next few days, and all the Playbook rules are quite similar.

Officials say 15,400 athletes are expected for the Olympics and Paralympics. The Olympics open on July 23 followed by the Paralympic on Aug. 24.

Including athletes, the total number expected for both events, factoring in media, broadcasters, Olympic Family, sponsors and others is about 93,000.

All those entering Japan for the Olympics will be required to follow complex testing rules before leaving home and after arriving.

They must also agree to have their location monitored by GPS, download several apps, sign a pledge to follow the rules, maintain social distancing, stay off public transportation for the

first 14 days and keep organizers informed of your whereabouts.

“We expect everybody to follow the rules. But we also have to be aware there could be infractions,” said Olympic Games Operations Director Pierre Ducrey, also speaking remotely.

“Yes, we expect you to play by the rules, but if you don’t there will be sanctions that could be coming your way,” Ducrey said the range of punishments could go from a warning, to temporary or permanent expulsion from the Olympics, to withdrawal of accreditation or a fine.

Officials also suggested the Japanese government has the power of deportation, and individual sports federations and national Olympic committees may have their own penalties.

Athletes are also being required to sign waivers, typical of the Olympics. This time an added clause relieves the IOC of responsibly from any fallout from COVID-19.

The International Olympic Committee says more than 80 per cent of those staying in the Olympic Village will be fully vaccinated. This contrasts with about 5 per cent of the Japanese population that has been vaccinated in a slow rollout that is just now speeding up.

The Japanese medical community has largely opposed holding these Olympics in Tokyo, arguing the risks are too great. The government’s main medical adviser Dr. Shigeru Omi has said it’s “abnormal” to hold the Olympics during a pandemic.

Fans from abroad have

been banned from Tokyo and organisers say a decision on having any local fans at Olympic venues will be announced by the end of the month.

The IOC is pushing ahead with all the contortions, partly because it gets almost 75 per cent of its revenue from selling broadcast rights. That income flow has been stalled during the postponement of the Tokyo Games.

In addition, Japan has officially spent \$15.4 billion on organizing the Olympics, although government audits say the figure is much larger.

Jeff Shell, who heads NBCUniversal, said this week these Olympics might be the most profitable ever, despite the pandemic.

China’s crew to new space station to lift off tomorrow

Beijing, June 16: China is all set to send the first three crew members to its new space station for three months on Thursday morning, the country’s space agency announced on Wednesday.

The spaceship, Shenzhou-12, with three male astronauts will be launched from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre, Ji Qiming, assistant to the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) director, said at a press conference held at the launch centre.

The spaceship will take Nie Haisheng, Liu Boming and Tang Hongbo into space for the construction of China’s space station. This will be the first manned mission during the construction of the space station, he said.

The mission is being launched ahead of the 100-year celebrations of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) to be held next month.

After entering the

orbit, the spaceship will conduct a fast automated rendezvous and docking with the in-orbit space station core module Tianhe, forming a complex with the core module and the cargo craft Tianzhou-2.

The astronauts aboard Shenzhou-12 will be stationed in the core module and remain in orbit for three months.

The launch will be carried out with a Long March-2F carrier rocket, which will be filled with propellant on Wednesday morning, Ji said.

China launched its space station core module Tianhe on April 29. After this China now plans to complete the verification of key technologies and the in-orbit construction of the space station through multiple launches within two years.

The space station still under construction is expected to be ready by next year.

Yang Liwei, director

of the China Manned Space Engineering Office who went into space in the Shenzhou-5 craft on October 15, 2003, said earlier that the astronauts will stay in space for three months, during which they will conduct tasks, including repair and maintenance.

In all, China plans to launch 11 space missions this year and next year before the space station is ready.

Three will be for modules, four for cargo spaceships and four for manned spaceships, according to official media reports.

Astronauts will conduct multiple tasks outside the cabin, carrying out repair and maintenance on the spacecraft, and other construction missions, Yang said.

“Astronauts coming out of the cabin will become a new routine, and the duration of such activities will be greatly expanded,” he said.

UK oppn blames India travel for spike

London, June 16: Britain’s Opposition Labour Party on Tuesday blamed the surge in Delta variant cases, which forced a four-week delay to ending the country’s lockdown until July 19, on Prime Minister Boris Johnson’s reluctance to ban travel from India where the highly transmissible variant was first identified.

Labour shadow home secretary Nick Thomas-Symonds dubbed it the Johnson variant as he accused the British prime minister of “unbelievably reckless” actions by not adding India to the red list of countries from where travel is effectively banned, with British residents able to return only under compulsory hotel quarantine.

According to official estimates, around 20,000 passengers who could have been infected with the Delta variant arrived from India from early April until April 23, when India was officially added to the red list.

“The delay is happening because a new variant first identified overseas was allowed to take hold in this country,” said Nick Thomas-Symonds during a House of Commons speech.

“There is one reason and one reason only that this happened lax border measures by Conservative ministers. They have allowed the Delta variant, first identified in India, to take hold here. Let’s call it what it is. Let’s put the blame where it should lie. In this country it’s the Johnson variant,” he said.

Labour, which is pushing for a Commons vote on the issue of border controls, pointed to Johnson’s planned visit to India at the end of April which had to be cancelled as the Delta variant spiralled India’s second wave of COVID-19 infections exponentially.

“It was unbelievably reckless that on his list of priorities Boris

Johnson put having his photograph taken with Prime Minister (Narendra) Modi ahead of protecting the British people. Nobody is blaming people who travelled when they were permitted to do so; the blame lies with the Prime Minister for his unjustifiable delay. It

was a fortnight of failure and we are all suffering the consequences,” added Thomas-Symonds.

UK Cabinet Office minister Michael Gove dismissed the allegations as rubbish and defended Johnson, saying the government would never put public lives at risk.

Afghan self goal helps India to qualify for next round

Doha, June 16: India scored from an own goal by Afghanistan goalie as they ended their World Cup Qualifiers campaign with a 1-1 draw to book a berth in the next qualifying round of the Asian Cup here on Tuesday.

A howler by Afghanistan goalie Ovays Azizi handed India a 1-0 lead in the 75th minute but Hossein Zamani equalised in the 81st minute in a match marred by poor refereeing.

The two sides had also played out a 1-1 draw in the first leg match in Dushanbe in 2019.

It was an open and fast-paced game with

the Afghans playing a more physical game in a match strewn with fouls and referee Ali Reda failing to discipline the players.

Both sides were almost equal in ball possession and India had 10 shots on target as against seven from Afghanistan. But the Afghans committed 16 fouls as against nine by the Indians. Three Afghan players were shown yellow cards as against one of India.

With seven points from eight matches, India finished third in Group E behind toppers Qatar and Oman, and ahead of Afghanistan (4th in group with six points from eight matches).

India under Igor Stimac ended the World Cup qualifying campaign with one win, four draws and three losses. Besides the win against Bangladesh in their previous match, the first leg 0-0 draw against Asian champions Qatar here in 2019 was the highlight of the campaign.

India dominated the early period with captain Sunil Chhetri having a go at the opposition goal in the 10th minute off a pass from Glan Martins but his left-footed shot from a difficult angle was collected by the Afghan goalie.
